The Least You Need to Know about Easter 2008

Give yourself about 30 minutes to find parking and take the shuttle to the church.

Park in the Hillcrest/Daniel Ave., Airline/Daniel Ave. or Moody Coliseum garages and take the shuttle to and from the church. Shuttles will run from 7:30 a.m. until 12:30 p.m. The lot directly north of the church will be completely reserved for cars with handicapped tags and will be accessible from Hillcrest.

Worship with your choice of services, beginning with the 6:45 a.m. Sunrise Service. Worship for children and adults in the church begins at 8:00 a.m. in four venues with services starting every 30 minutes (see list at left).

Children ages 0-3 can stay in KidCare free with a reservation (214.523.2201).


