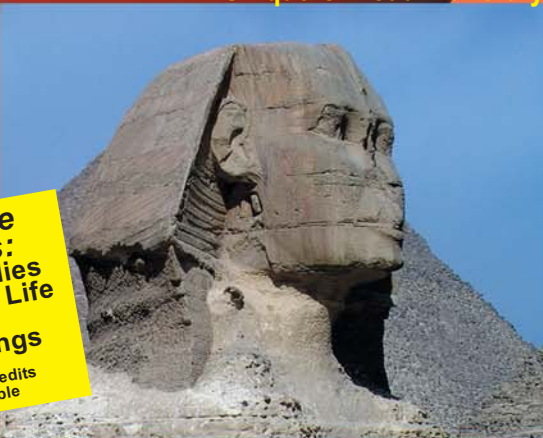

Nov. 11 and 12 USA to Athens Your pilgrimage begins as you board your international flight for **Athens**. You will be met by our airport representative to begin your Athens sightseeing.

The architectural splendors of the ancient city of **Athens** are as magical as ever. Follow your guide on a journey to the ancient **Acropolis** where you will see the **Propylaea**, the **Parthenon** and the **Erectheum**. View **Mars Hill** where Paul preached the gospel to the intellectual Athenian community of his day (Acts 17: 15-34). View the ruins of the **Agora**, ancient market place and center of Athenian public life, where Paul preached to the skeptical Athenians. You will view the **Olympic Stadium**, where the modern Olympics began and where the games returned in 2004. Following today's sightseeing you will be transferred to your Athens hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 13 Corinth This morning travel to **Corinth** (Acts 18: 1-18), a city that inspired one of St. Paul's most familiar letters. You will visit the **Archaeological Museum**, the **Market Place**, and **Temples**. Walk among the ruins and stand on the **Bema** where Paul stood. Read Paul's letter to the Corinthians and visualize his address to the Gentiles as he began the task of building Corinth's church. Imagine where Aquila and Priscilla lived and where they had their tent making business. This afternoon you will board your lovely cruise ship the *mv Cristal* and sail for Port Said, Egypt.

Nov. 14 Day at Sea

Nov. 15 Port Said and Cairo Dock in **Port Said** and travel to Cairo. Begin your tour of **Cairo** with a visit to the **Egypt Museum** which houses the **King Tut treasures** and many other artifacts from Egypt's long history. Visit the **Great Pyramids of Giza**, the last remaining ancient wonder, built before Moses and the Israelites were even in this ancient land. This evening set sail for Ashdod.

Nov. 16 Jerusalem Dock in the port of **Ashdod** travel to **Jerusalem** and visit the **Upper Room**, the traditional site of the Last Supper. Visit the **House of the High Priest Caiaphas**, where Jesus was tried before the Sanhedrin. Stand upon the **Mount of Olives** and view the city as Jesus did. Wander among the olive trees of the **Garden of Gethsemane**. Enter the **Old City** and visit the **Pool of Bethesda**. You'll walk along the **Via Dolorosa** to the **Church of the Holy Sepulchre**. Continue on to the **Western Wall** to pray before returning to the ship. (Lunch will be on your own today.)

Nov. 17 Bethlehem Travel to **Bethlehem** where you'll visit the cave revered as the place where Jesus was born (Matt. 1: 18 - 25; Luke 2: 1-7). The church, which was constructed on the site, is the world's oldest functioning church. Nearby you'll view **Shepherds' Field** where the Good News was first heard. Set sail this evening for Haifa.

Nov. 18 The Galilee Your cruise ship docks in the port of **Haifa**. Travel inland to the **Sea of Galilee**. Much of the Gospel is centered around the Sea. You'll stand on the **Mount of the Beatitudes** where Jesus gave his most famous sermon (Luke 6:12-49). At **Tabgha**, the traditional location for the calling of the disciples and the feeding of the 5000, you'll visit the **Church of the Fish and the Loaves** (Luke 9:10-17). Visit the **Chapel of the Primacy** where three times Peter professed his devotion to the risen Christ (John 21). Travel to the shore town of **Capernaum** where Jesus called Peter, Andrew, James, John (Matt 4:13) and later Matthew. Stop by the **River Jordan** where those who wish to be baptized may do so.

Nov. 19 At Sea

Nov. 20 Rhodes Paul visited **Rhodes** briefly on his way to Jerusalem at the end of his 3rd missionary journey (Acts 21:1). Centuries later the crusaders known as the Knights of St. John fled Jerusalem

and settled on the Island of Rhodes. You will see the castles and the old city they built which still impress visitors. The knights lasted for two centuries until they plundered one too many Moslem pilgrim ships, enraging Suleiman the Magnificent who lost 50 thousand men in his successful bid to take the island

Nov. 21 Ephesus Your cruise ship will dock in Kusadasi. Journey to **Ephesus**, the marble city where Paul spent 3 years of his ministry. It was to this community that Paul wrote his epistle to the Ephesians. The ruins of Ephesus have been restored so it is easy to get in touch with the city in Paul's time. You will visit the ancient **Agora** and imagine where Demetrius, the silversmith, sold his silver shrines of the Greek goddess, Artemis. See the library of Celsus and enter the Great Theatre mentioned in the book of Acts.

Those taking the Istanbul or Churches of Asia Minor extension will disembark and overnight in Kusadasi. You will begin your extension tomorrow. All other passengers will sail back to Athens.

Nov. 22 Piraeus and Return to the USA Return home with memories to share or begin an exciting extension. **NOTE: Passengers who began the trip with the Nile Cruise Pre-Tour or the Wonders of Egypt Pre-Tour will do Athens/Corinth today and will return to the USA on Nov 23.**

Nov. 22 - Colossae, Laodicea, and Hierapolis

Famous as the receiver of Paul's Letter to the Colossians, the town of **Colossae** has fallen into obscurity. The Christians of **Laodicea**, one of the Seven Churches (Rev. 3: 14-22), were chastised for being lukewarm. Today, there are many acres of ruins to see, including the stadium and columned streets. Paul mentions **Hierapolis** in his Letter to the Colossians in saluting Epaphras, a fellow laborer, for his love of the brethren there (Col 4: 13). Today, the area is known as **Pamukkale**, meaning "Cotton Castle", named for the limestone-laden hot springs which cascade from one white-edged terrace pool to the next.

Nov. 23 - Antioch in Psidia and Iconium

Travel to the remains of **Antioch in Psidia** where Paul and Barnabas ministered in the synagoge (Acts 13:14-52) and converted many of the Gentiles in the city. Continue to the modern Turkish city of **Konya** which was ancient **Iconium** (Acts 14:1-6) for overnight.

Nov. 24 - Derbe and Lystra

Travel to the cities of **Derbe** and **Lystra**. While little remains of either city, Paul and Barnabas spent much time preaching there and were even stoned and left for dead in Lystra (Acts 14:6-22). Continue to the **Cappadocia** region for overnight.

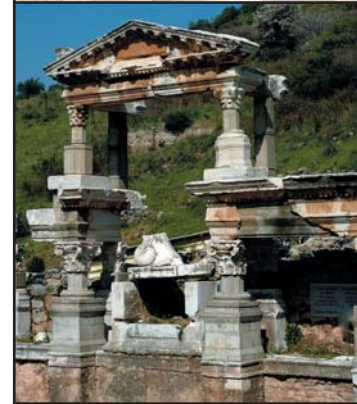
Nov. 25 - Cappadocia

Tour **Cappadocia** where over 3000 rock churches exist. You will visit the **Rock Chapels of Goreme**, the **Cave Village of Avclar** and the **Monastic Complex of Zelve**. Late this afternoon, fly to Istanbul where you will overnight.
