As of today, over 240 participants attend our programs, and thanks to the generosity of HPUMC families, volunteers, and staff, participants are also provided a safe place to discover their purposes and continue to grow in confidence, faith, and community. We look forward to an exciting year of programs and welcoming new members into the Belong family.
